Weekly Creative Challenge...

Mexico is a country in North America just south of the United States. Before the arrival of the Spanish in 1521, it was home to many **Mesoamerican** tribes like the Mayas and the Aztecs. Mexico celebrates its Independence Day on the 16th of September. The 16th of September, however, celebrates another important day... National Guacamole Day!





Guacamole is a mix of mashed avocado and spices. Avocados were first cultivated in Mexico approximately 10,000 years ago and the earliest historical recordings of guacamole come from around 500 years ago! An interesting fact about avocados is that many English-speakers formerly called them "alligator pears" because of their skin texture. The word 'guacamole' actually comes from the Aztec word ahuacamolli which translates as "avocado sauce".

Many guacamole recipes only call for a few ingredients (avocados, salt, lime juice), but you can add extra ingredients to change the delicious flavour!

Here's a few suggestions:

-Bacon & feta

-Tomato -Honey -Black bean & corn -Pomegranate seeds -Parmesan & basil

This week is *Place2Be*'s Children's Mental Health Week. Every day in tutor or in your house assembly, you should be hearing helpful tips on how to manage your well-being and mental health.



Why is mental health and well-being important?

- 1 in 6 children and young people have a diagnosable mental health problem, and many continue to have these problems into adulthood.
- 50% of those with lifetime mental health problems first experience symptoms by the age of 14.
- 1 in 10 boys aged 5-19 with a mental health condition are excluded in some form from school.

Challenge:

- 2. Teach someone at home one of the strategies you learned.
