Well-Being & Looking after ourselves...

Everyone knows the importance of getting enough sleep—not only does it repair your body and mind, it also helps you sort out all the information you take in during the day. However, many people don't realise the importance of keeping a regular sleep schedule.



Keeping a regular sleep schedule (going to bed and waking up at the same time every day) maintains the timing of your body's internal clock and helps make falling asleep in general much easier. This is important because many young people aren't getting enough sleep as it is! Experts agree that teenagers between 13-18 should be getting 8-10 hours of sleep each night.

While it might be tempting to stay up later during the Easter holiday to play videogames or watch television, it is not good for your overall sleep health. You should aim to go to bed and wake up roughly at the same as you do for school.
