Reflection

In this reading the importance of treating strangers with fairness and kindness is emphasized. It instructed the Israelites not to wrong the strangers living in their land.

In the Old Testament 'strangers' referred to individuals from other nations who had settled among the Israelites. In modern terms this would be an individual moving from one country and settling in another.
