In year 8 students are offered the opportunity to take part in a retreat at the Diocesan Youth Village.








Academic Progress





Ambition at St Bede's and Byron Sixth Form

From Year 7 to Year 13, the Ambition Programme provides wrap-around support for all elements of development relating to future careers, university applications and higher-level apprenticeships

We focus our support in a variety of ways:

- Encouraging holistic opportunities linked to personal development and the FAITH award
- Exploring meaningful encounters with universities
- Developing subject passions.
- Linking students with future careers, particularly hard-to-reach careers like medicine, engineering, television and journalism



Success Stories:

In its first year, the Ambition Programme supported five students at Oxbridge interviews - including one successful place (History, Pembroke College, Oxford University) - and one successful medical application (Medicine, St Andrews University)

This year, the Ambition Programme has supported seven applications to elite courses (Oxford, Cambridge and Medicine) as well as multiple applications to other Russell Group universities and other competitive courses including midwifery, paramedic science and primary education.

Year 12 - Applying to Competitive Universities - Trinity College, Oxford University


What's coming up?

- Spelling, Oracy And Reading is our whole school literacy strategy we are very proud to be a 'reading school'
- Every term, KS3 students complete reading comprehension tests to provide reading ages so books suited for their reading age and level can be directed to them
- Reading for progress In KS3, one lesson every fortnight is timetabled for Accelerated Reader - a programme designed to drive progress in reading ages through using a reading age to target specific texts
- Reading for pleasure Every morning, every student takes part in Tutor Reading - group reading a text from our Reading Canon. Students with lower reading ages take part in smaller groups to facilitate more targeted discussion and support (SOAR Reading Groups - reading for confidence)
- Reading for fun Every student has the opportunity to join a book club, organised by our school librarian, Miss Blakelock
- Reading for knowledge in lessons, subject teachers direct students to additional articles, books or websites that students can access to improve their understanding and wider knowledge of a topic - Scholarly Reading

- Every week, in every subject, all students are introduced to a Word of the Week (Tier 2 or Tier 3 vocabulary) - they learn the etymology of the word, how it is applied in that subject and how it is linked to that particular week's learning
- On Friday afternoon, every student completes a 'SOAR Word Test' to assess their recall of the word's spelling and students' progress is recorded
- In every subject, every cycle (term), students will complete a Key Task composed of a piece of extended writing - this is to ensure they recognise the cross-curricular importance of writing as well as applying their writing skills to their specific subject learning
- An array of staff from across our departments have specialist phonics training in order to allow them to assist students in decoding new words

Personal Development

Our PSHE programme of study is designed in a way that reflects the ethos of our school that every child is uniquely created and loved by God. The Year 8 programme of study includes:

- Health and Well-being
- Work-related learning
- Relationships
- British Values
- Financial awareness
- Keeping safe

Relationships and sex is taught following the Ten Ten programme, which is fully supported by our Catholic Diocese. Our RSHE policy is on our school website.

Personal Development

- We have a wide range of extracurricular clubs and opportunities for students to develop their talents or try something new
- Last year we launched our Faith Award to celebrate our students' participation in the extracurricular life of St. Bede's. This year we are continuing to develop this award, with an even wider range of opportunities for students at lunch or after school.
- This half term, students have been working towards their bronze award by attending a minimum of 5 extra-curricular sessions. After the half term break students will be building on this and will be working towards their silver award.
