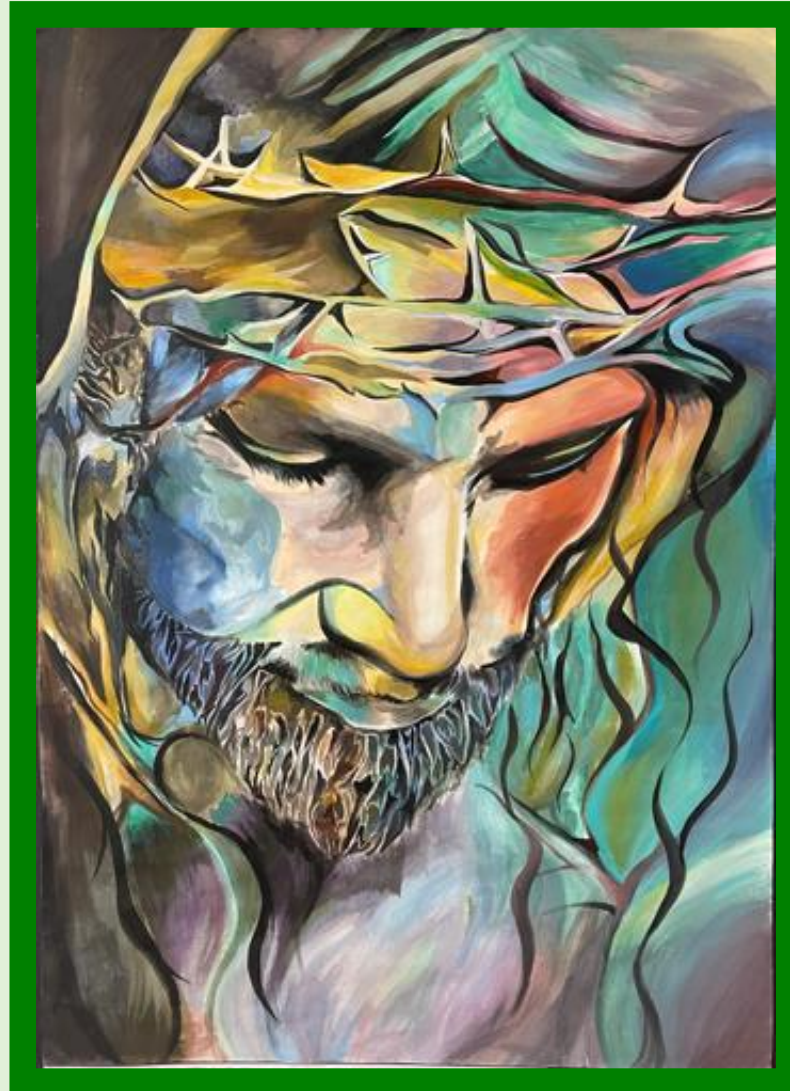

What is a Saint?

Saints are good men and women who followed God and have now died. Some of the saints could heal, some could work miracles and others had the ability to be in two places at once.

In Roman Catholicism and certain other Christian faith traditions, a saint is a holy person who is known for his or her "heroic sanctity" and who is thought to be in heaven. In the 10th century, Pope John XV formalized a process for the identification of saints. Before that time, saints were largely established by public cult.

There are more than 10,000 saints recognized by the Roman Catholic Church, though the names and histories of some of these holy men and women have been lost to history.

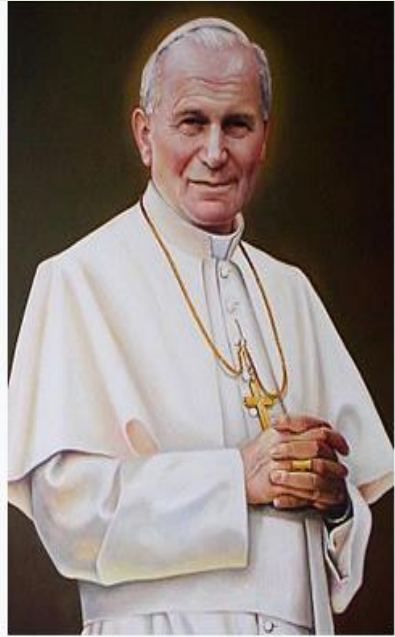
Hail Mary, full of grace,

Pope John Paul II



- Pope John Paul II was born Karol Józef Wojtyła. He was born in Poland on the 18th May 1920.
- Pope John Paul II was head of the Catholic Church from the 16th October 1978 to his death on the 2nd April 2005. He was the second longest-serving pope in history and the first non-Italian pope in over 455 years.
- He was the most travelled pope, making 104 international trips. He was the first ever pope to visit a mosque, which is a place of worship in Islam.
- John Paul II was canonised by Pope Francis in 2014, which means he is now known as Saint John Paul II.

One day when Pope John Paul II was blessing all the people in the crowded Square of St. Peter's in Rome, one man in the crowd fired his gun and the bullet hit the Pope in the stomach. Immediately, his car gathered speed to take him away and his bodyguard took care of his wounds. He was rushed to hospital and everybody thought he would die. Luckily, he didn't die and he lived to carry on his life and good works.

One day, he decided he would go to the prison where the assassin was being held. He wanted to show he had forgiven this man for what he had done. The two men made peace with one another. Much later when the Pope died, the man was seen at his funeral.

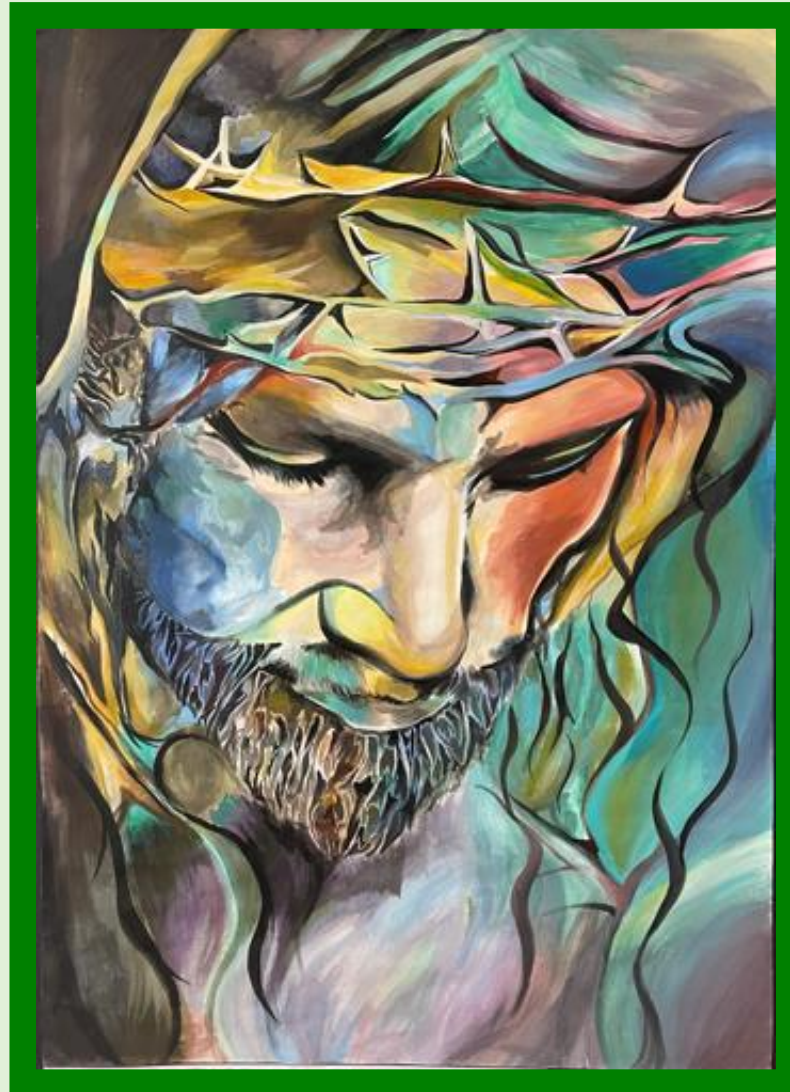
