

Moina Michael and the Poppy

9th November, 1918 – Moina Michael sits in the office of the YMCA Overseas War Secretaries Headquarters in New York. On her break she flips through the pages of the 'Ladies Home Journal' and finds a reprint of the 'In Flanders Field' poem. She vows then to always remember the troops and writes her own poem in reply on the back of an envelope.

She decides to wear a poppy to remember the men and goes out to buy as many silk poppies as she can from a local department store. She sells and gives them away to the delegates of a war conference taking place in the building. They tell the rest of the delegates about the idea.

Where did the idea come from to use a poppy as a symbol of Remembrance?



Amen.




