Arbor Parent Portal

Friday 28 On March we will launch our free Parent Portal and Parent App using our Management Information System, Arbor. Parents/carers will receive an email with login details.

Initially, parents and carers will be able to track attendance, view their children's timetables and receive instant notificaitons from school.

Over the coming weeks and months we will introduce more features that we hope will make communication between school and home stronger.

From September 2025, we will move our behaviour system to Arbor too.



We're using Arbor's free Parent Portal and Parent App

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Parent App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Parent App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday


Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor. Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- 3. If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the **password link will have expired**. Ask us to send it again.
- 4. Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- 6. Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.

Mathematics Department celebrates St Patrick's Day!





Returning to School after Sickness

To ensure the health and well-being of all students and staff, please follow these guidelines regarding your child's return to school after illness:

- If your child has a **single episode of sickness** (not related to a contagious illness), they may return to school **after 24 hours**, provided they are feeling well.
- If your child has a sickness bug (vomiting or diarrhoea due to a virus or infection), please adhere to the **48-hour rule** they should remain at home for **at least 48 hours** after the last episode to prevent the spread of illness.

Spanish: OPTION

At KS4, students deepen their Spanish skills while exploring real-world topics that prepare them for both their GCSE exams and life beyond the classroom.

In Year 10, students begin by diving into technology, social media, and celebrity culture, learning about key Spanish-speaking influencers like Rosalía, Ibai Llanos, and Shakira. They then focus on the environment, their local area, and free time activities, as well as essential topics like travel, tourism, family, and relationships helping students to build their practical language skills while preparing for their GCSE.

In Year 11, the focus shifts to cultural traditions and festivals across the Hispanic world, as well as life style, and future plans. Students also refine their language skills to discuss relationships and marriage, while practicing essential GCSE exam techniques to ensure success in their exams.

With a blend of modern themes and cultural exploration, KS4 Spanish helps students gain confidence, broaden their perspectives, and develop skills for real-world communication.

POST-GCSE PATHWAY: Studying at our Sixth Form

A Level Spanish

At KS5, our Spanish curriculum offers students a dynamic and enriching journey into the language and culture of the Hispanic world. Following the AQA specification, students not only develop their linguistic skills but also engage with cultural topics that broaden their global understanding.

Throughout year 12 and 13, we explore key themes such as cyberspace, regional identity, gender equality, the influence of celebrities, social values, coexistence, immigration, monarchies and dictatorships, racism and youth issues in Spanish-speaking countries. These topics encourage students to think critically about contemporary social issues while enhancing their ability to communicate in Spanish with confidence and fluency.

In addition to these themes, students have the opportunity to immerse themselves in Hispanic the critically acclaimed film El laberinto del fauno, a visually stunning and deeply symbolic story set in post-Civil War Spain, and the novel Como agua para chocolate, which blends magical realism with themes of love, tradition, and revolution. These works provide a deeper cultural and historical context, enriching students' understanding of the Spanish-speaking world.

A Level Psychology

Are you fascinated by the workings of the human mind? Are you curious about why people think and behave the way they do, and how psychological theories apply to real-world issues?

Why Choose A-Level Psychology?

- Explore the Mind: Study topics such as social influence, memory, attachment, psychopathology, biopsychology, gender, schizophrenia and aggression.
- Develop Critical Skills: Learn to analyse data, assess research studies, and think critically—skills that are valuable in higher education and in many careers.
- Real-World Application: Whether you want to work in healthcare, education, law, or marketing, psychology is an essential tool in understanding people.

What are the requirements for studying A-level Psychology?

Psychology is classified as a Science subject and this is reflected in the biopsychology and research methods content. Mathematical skills represent at least 10% of the overall assessment with research methods representing 25-30%.

You will sit three exams, each lasting two hours, at the end of the second year of study. The exams consist of multiple choice, short answer and extended writing questions.
