
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Determination





FSM & Additional Funding for Schools

Alt is really important that you register for Free School Meals if you are entitled as the school receives additional grant funding from the government which makes a big difference to the school, providing additional funding to help support pupils' education. If you are registered for FSM, you may also be able to access school holiday meal vouchers. If you receive one of the following benefits, we would be most grateful if you could apply for your child's Free School Meals using the link below:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190



POST-GCSE PATHWAY: Studying at our Sixth Form

BTEC National in Business (Sixth Form KS5)

The BTEC National in Business course is a vocational course that introduces learners to a range of business concepts. The course is assessed by students completing two coursework units and two external exams. The first coursework unit encourages students to explore and compare two different contrasting types of business, their ownership and how they are structured and affected by external factors and how innovation has been used by businesses to meet the needs of customers.



The two examinations take place in Year 12 and the coursework units are completed in Year 13. The course develops students' skills of analysis, evaluation and research. It is viewed favorably by universities as it prepares students well for the experience of working independently at university. Students who follow this course have progressed onto degree courses in a wide range of subjects from Business Management to Event planning. A BTEC Business course combines well with many other A level subjects

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Arbor Parent Portal

Today we have launched our free Parent Portal and Parent App using our Management Information System, Arbor. Parents/carers should have received an email with login details.

Initially, parents and carers will be able to track attendance, view their children's timetables and receive instant notificaitons from school.

Over the coming weeks and months we will introduce more features that we hope will make communication between school and home stronger.

From September 2025, we will move our behaviour system to Arbor too.

We're using Arbor's free Parent Portal and Parent App


We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Parent App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Parent App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday




Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor.
 Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.
