#### St. Bede's Visit Number 10!

In the (very) early hour of 4am last Friday, a class of Year 9 pupils set off for what became a truly special and most memorable day.

Organised through the Maths Department, the trip was open to every Year 9 pupil, with those who have been appointed "Maths Legends" offered a guaranteed space.

After a 6 hour coach ride, culminating in a great drive past some of central London's most iconic landmarks, we arrived at Whitehall - which had held VE Day celebrations just 24 hours before our visit.

After a security search and handing over all our electronic devices, we were greeted by a surprise VIP, Member of Parliament for Easington, Graeme Morris who spoke with his younger constituents and answered their questions.

Then, we entered Downing Street, seeing the famous door for the first time before getting pictures and stepping through it to what we realised was a "tardis" of a building. We were particularly thrilled to see Larry, the official Mouser to the Prime Minister" leave No 10 for a morning explore!

Initially, we were guided through the building to the State Dining Room where we were offered the most generous selection of biscuits, drinks and snacks. As it turns out, some of the chairs offered to us were worth over £200,000!

After getting through the initial excitement, our tour began - we saw the palatial splendour of the Pillared Room and the State Drawing Room, which had hosted WW2 veterans and the Prime Minister the previous evening. In the White Room (often seen on TV with a visiting Head of State and the Prime Minister in front of a fireplace and union flags), we sat in the chair where Presidents Obama, Biden, Zelenskyy and Von Der Leyen have all sat recently! We got to see two Turner paintings up close, worth a combined value of over £31 million.

We got the opportunity to touch the first ever moon rock from the 1969 moon landing of Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin, as well as the personal note from 33 miners who were trapped in Chile over a decade ago that confirmed they were still alive.

Then, we descended the "Prime Minister's Staircase" adorned with a portrait of every Prime Minister since the very first, Sir Robert Warpole - and, no, there was no dancing Prime Minister this time!

The Cabinet Room awaited us, the famous long table where Churchill once sat, where we were told different features of the room and got to sit where some of our Secretaries of State sit to make decisions affecting all of us.









#### St. Bede's Visit Number 10! (continued)

As we returned to the (wood panelled) State Dining Room, we tucked into our packed lunch in the room that has hosted Presidents, Prime Ministers, Kings and Queens for hundreds of years - as well as hosting the 2020 Covid Briefings from PM Boris Johnson and Sir Chris Whitty.

Our guides could not have been more gracious - insisting this was the "British people's" house and encouraging the pupils to touch and get close to as many artefacts and historical objects as possible.

Leaving Downing Street, we then walked down Horse Guard's Parade, seeing the Churchill War Rooms, proceeding to walk up The Mall, before a mandatory picture in front of Buckingham Palace. Returning back down The Mall, we walked through St James' Park and Whitehall, seeing the Foreign & Commonwealth Office, The National Cenotaph, the Houses of Parliament and the Elizabeth Tower. Crossing over a very busy Westminster Bridge, we saw our next stop; the London Eye.

Getting into two pods and making the most of perfect weather, our 30 minute rotation allowed us to see some of London's landmarks from above - Wembley, The Ministry of Defence, Waterloo Station, Kensington Palace to name a few. Some pupils even reckon they spotted the Eiffel and Blackpool Towers...!

After alighting our pods, we had a quick scout of a gift shop, got some ice cream and relaxed on a green for 20 minutes before getting on our coach to take us back to St Bede's. A jam-packed 5 hours in London where we managed to see over a dozen of London's most famous landmarks!

Our pupils behaved immaculately, with multiple members of the public and Downing Street staff complimenting them they were a true credit to St Bede's and their families exemplifying our values in everything they did. We were incredibly proud of them. We would like to thank Miss Tilston, Mr Wilson, Miss Jones and Mr Taylor for facilitating the trip and a day that was as equally as memorable for them as it was for the pupils!
