Through our words, actions and through the power of the Holy Spirit, we too can be God's witnesses, through living our lives the way Jesus shows us.


Excellence

Pope Francis

This week, we have gathered today as a school community to pray for Pope Francis and to think about the example that he has set us. Pope Francis was well known for his work in several key areas, including:

- Social Justice and Advocacy for the Poor: He has consistently emphasized the need to care for the marginalized, criticizing economic inequality and calling for a more inclusive global economy.
- Environmental Stewardship: His 2015 encyclical Laudato Si' called for urgent action on climate change and environmental protection, marking a significant moment in the Catholic Church's engagement with ecological issues.
- Interfaith Dialogue: He has worked to improve relationships between the Catholic Church and other religious communities, including Islam and Judaism, emphasizing peace and mutual respect. He was also known for his work engaging with and empowering young people in a variety of ways, including:
- World Youth Day: He has actively participated in World Youth Day events, encouraging young Catholics to be agents of change, live out their faith boldly, and build a more just and compassionate world.
- The Synod on Young People (2018): Pope Francis convened a special synod titled "Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment," where he listened to the voices of youth from around the world and emphasized the Church's need to walk with them in their struggles and hopes.
- Focus on Listening and Inclusion: Francis has consistently called for the Church to be a place where young people are heard and valued, particularly in matters of justice, peace, and care for the environment.

3G Pitch: Football Foundation Consultation

We are launching a consultation with the local community and partners with a view to enhancing the facilties at the school by installing a 3G football turf pitch.

This artificial pitch would be suitable for a variety of sports and would also be floodlit.

In relation to this project, key priority areas for the project are:

- Women & Girls provision
- · Working with culturally diverse communities
- Engaging people with long term health conditions, disability users
- Engaging people from lower socio-economic groups



NEXT STEPS

The school is working with sports bodies to secure their support and we need to evidence the need for the pitch and the benefits it will bring. We encourage everyone to take part in the consultation process which runs from 1 May - 23 May 2025 via a questionnaire which can be accessed by scanning the QR code or be completed online via the following link: https://forms.office.com/r/MRgkHh3w9G

As part of the consultation process we want to meet with local organisations, across the community to:

- Understand your aspirations
- · Outline what you want to see delivered at the site
- · What usage of the pitch looks like

More Legends Appointed in the Maths Department!


