It is important that our children show they belong by wearing the appropriate PE Kit to school - both on sports day and in all PE lessons. Our PE kit fosters a sense of unity and pride among pupils, ensuring they are well-prepared and comfortable for their activities. This includes wearing the official school black t-shirt and shorts from www.theschooloutfit.co.uk or plain black equivalent. Suitable sports footwear must also be worn. Each item is designed to encourage optimal performance while promoting school spirit. Pupils are reminded to maintain their kits in good condition and to label them with their names to prevent any mix-ups. By adhering to the school's dress code, students contribute to a cohesive and respectful learning environment. Pupils must bring kit even if they are not able to take part in sporting activity as they can participate in other ways. This is particularly important when outside and the weather may wet their school uniform. Pupils not participating must have a note from parents / carers in their planner. The school has laundered kit for those few occassions when pupils do forget their St. Bede's black kit.
