



A young carer is someone under the age of 18 who helps care for a family member or loved one who is ill, disabled, has a mental health condition, or struggles with substance misuse. It's a role that requires maturity, compassion, and strength – often far beyond what's expected at such a young age.

What Does a Young Carer Do?

Every situation is different, but many young carers find themselves:


- Helping with everyday tasks like cooking, cleaning, or shopping
