Pupils keep coming to see Mrs Cessford and Mr Logan each Friday at breaktime to show them work they're proud of. Please encourage your children to show us their books.














Maths Department unveils our first ever Maths Roll of Honour





Labcoat Legends




This Week in Food Technology



Attendance

Our school attendance target is 97%. The overall attendance for last year was 91.37%. It is imperative that we continue to work together to do all we can to prioritise our children's attendance at school.

We ask that Parents/Carers support good attendance in the following ways:



- Make school attendance a priority.
- Arrive at school on time the student entrance opens at 8:30am and closes at 8:45am.
- Contact the school to report each daily absence by 9.15am via telephone on 0191 587 6220 (option 1 to report student absence).
- Children should return to school as soon as they are able to do so after an illness.
- If you have ANY concerns about attendance, please do not hesitate to speak to our attendance officer, Miss Gunn, in the first instance or your child's Head of House.

Unauthorised Absence includes:

- Arriving late to school
- Shopping trips
- Birthday treat which results in their absence from school
- Absence from school with no reason
- Child off school as sibling/parent is unwell
- Child off school as sibling/parent has a medical appointment

Holidays in Term Time

There are 190 school days and 175 other days in the year that can be used for holidays and other occasions. The school academic year is set out a year in advance and available on the school website

A reminder that we **DO NOT** authorise holidays during term time. Leave of absence applications are intended for families where there is an exceptional circumstance that requires a child to be away from school. If you do feel that you have an exceptional reason for requesting leave of absence, please complete a leave of absence form, available from the school office.

PLEASE CAN WE KINDLY REQUEST THAT YOU MAKE DENTAL AND MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL TIME. IF THIS IS NOT POSSIBLE, APPOINTMENT LETTERS/TEXTS WILL NEED TO BE SEEN BY THE SCHOOL OFFICE.

Safeguarding: Understanding Early Help

Early Help is about identifying and supporting children and families as soon as problems emerge. It's not just for those at immediate risk - children who are frequently absent, face exclusion, or have a parent in custody may all benefit from early intervention.

By acting early, schools can prevent issues from escalating. Our staff are alert to subtle signs and know how to refer concerns to the safeguarding team. Early Help is everyone's responsibility.

Through partnerships with local agencies and professionals, we offer a network of support that extends beyond the school. This ensures that children and families have access to the help they need, whether it's counseling, academic support, or community service - please get in touch with your child's Head of House if you think the Early Help Service could support you.

School Car Park - Road Safety
