
Admissions Criteria

All students are considered on their individual merit and situation, the general admissions criteria is a guide to support your choices. Students will be offered a place at Byron Sixth Form on the provison that they meet the following criteria:

At least five grades at 4+ and a minimum of a Grade 5 at GCSE in the subject they want to study (a grade 6 or higher at GCSE will be required for science and mathematics).

What's the difference?

A-Level qualifications are generally more exam-based. Exams are taken at the end of Year 13. Some subjects have coursework elements like Product Design, English Literature, Geography and History or have practical elements like the science subjects. Others are entirely exambased like Psychology. BTECs are modular meaning you have opportunities to take exams through Year 12 and 13. BTECs also have a heavy emphasis on coursework.

Students at Byron Sixth Form can take any combination of BTEC and A-Level courses are a free to mix and match between A-Levels and BTECs.

Enrichment: Forming the whole person, preparing students to be future ready.




