

## British Council International School Award Success for St. Bede's


We are delighted to have been awarded Foundation level of the British Council's prestigious International School Award in recognition of our work to bring the world into the classroom.






#### Fire Service Visit Highlights Water Safety at Shotton Pond

This week, we were pleased to welcome members of the local Fire and Rescue Service, who visited our school to deliver an important session on safety in and around water, with a particular focus on Shotton Pond, a popular but potentially dangerous spot in our local area.

The firefighters led an engaging and informative talk for our students, raising awareness about the hidden risks of open water, especially during warmer months when ponds and lakes can seem inviting.



#### **Key topics included:**

- The dangers of cold water shock
- Hidden hazards beneath the water's surface
- What to do in an emergency
- The importance of never swimming alone or in unsupervised areas

The visit was part of a wider campaign to help young people make safe choices around water and to reduce the number of preventable accidents during school breaks and holidays. We're incredibly grateful to the Fire Service for their time, knowledge, and dedication to keeping our community safe.

The message was clear: "Respect the water, think before you act, and always choose safety first." We encourage families to continue the conversation at home and help reinforce these vital safety messages.


## Maths Department celebrates the contributions of the Greek mathematicians during European Day of Languages!

Friday marked European Day of Languages 2025 and, in the Maths Department, we didn't want the occasion to pass us by without celebrating!

In Year 8 lessons, pupils were taught letters of the Greek alphabet, learning how they represent key concepts within maths (from circles, to right-angled triangles and standard deviation) as well as deciphering Greek messages and writing words and names in Greek. Teachers used this opportunity to discuss the British Values of tolerance and democracy and pupils really enjoyed exploring a different type of maths lesson.

During Year 6 Open Evening, we recognised the Greeks' contributions to engineering and sport. We built the Parthenon out of spaghetti and marshmallows, made Olympic torches, hosted a Maths Olympics with times table relays and applied probability to chariot racing! We even had our very own London 2012 Olympic torch in the department, thanks to Mrs Keniry!

#### A Visit from Lord Shipley: Learning with the Lords

Today we had the privilege of enjoying Lord Shipley's company. A current member of the House of Lords, Lord Shipley led two sessions with pupils from Year 11. He discussed his role and how the House of Lords operates, answering questions posed to him by our pupils.

The pupils were captivated by his insights, as he shared anecdotes from his extensive career in public service and offered a glimpse into the workings of the British political system. His engaging storytelling and genuine pupils' questions interest in the lively sparked discussions, encouraging the pupils to think critically about governance and their own potential roles in society.



#### **Attendance Update**

This week's focus is on **TERM TIME HOLIDAYS** 

Parents/carers can be sent a Penalty Notice for taking their children out of school in term time for the purpose of a holiday.

All families who take an unauthorised absence of five days or more will receive a Penalty Notice unless the circumstances are considered to be exceptional.

Payment is payable up to £160 per child, per parent, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.

From August last year, only two fines can be issued to the same parent for the same child within a three-year rolling period. Any second notice will automatically be charge at £160.

Any Further Offences (within a three-year rolling period) will be referred straight to the Magistrate Court.

This could lead to:

- Prosecution under s444 (I) Education Act 1996, where if convicted you may be fined up to £1,000
- Prosecution under s444 (I) (a) Education Act 1996, where if convicted you may be fined up to £2,500 and/or 12 weeks imprisonment.

We are aware that some families take time off school and call their child in as 'off sick'. If we have reason to believe your child has been away from school due to a family holiday rather than illness, we will write to you and ask for evidence such as medication or a screen print from the GP. We believe that if your child is off school for a week, medical advice should have been sought at some point. If we do not receive this evidence, you may still be liable for a penalty notice.
