





Safeguarding: The Role of Attendance in Safeguarding

Being absent from school can be a red flag. <u>Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE) 2025</u> highlights that absence - not just going missing - can signal abuse, exploitation, or neglect.

KCSIE 2025 advises that staff should look beyond the register. Patterns of absence, lateness, or disengagement may indicate deeper issues. Attendance is a safeguarding concern, not just an admin task.

Why School Attendance Matters

- There are 190 school days in a year.
- That leaves 175 days for holidays, appointments and family time.
- Missing just 10% of school (around 19 days) each year adds up to nearly half a year lost over five years.

Every school day counts - here's how attendance can impact learning:

Days Absent	Days Attended	Attendance Rate	Impact on Learning
0 days	190 days	100%	Excellent - full access to learning opportunities
10 Days	180 days	95%	Great - strong chance of success
19 days	171 days	90%	Concerning - learning may be affected
29 days	161 days	85%	Risk - gaps in knowledge likely
38 days	152 days	80%	Serious concern - significant impact on progress
47 days	143 days	75%	High risk - reduced outcomes and opportunities
