






Musicians of the Week



Year 10 Mathematicians celebrate the life of David Blackwell

With October marking Black History Month, as part of the personal development curriculum in maths, our Year 10 pupils have been learning about the life and contributions of David Blackwell. He was a pioneer in the field of mathematics and statistics, becoming the seventh African American in US history to gain a PhD in Maths and Statistics. His contributions to the topic of game theory were particularly special; therefore, in lessons, Year 10 pupils have been learning about game theory and understanding how it can be used to represent real life problems, such as the "prisoner's dilemma" or the nuclear arms race. Pupils were able to connect this learning to their prior knowledge of British Values and protected characteristics to ensure they leave us as the citizens that God intended them to be!

A Level students take part in United Kingdom Maths Trust **Senior Maths Challenge**

Last Thursday, nearly 20 Year 12 and Year 13 pupils took part in a 90 minute UKMT Maths Challenge, competing against thousands of pupils across the UK. Pupils faced a variety of abstract and applied questions to test their mathematical understanding and problem solving skills. For pupils wishing to pursue a maths-related degree, this was a critical experience discussed UČAS applications be on university/apprenticeship/job interviews. In the coming months, pupils shall find out if they achieved Bronze, Silver or Gold status, with some having the possibility of teaming up to compete against the best mathematicians in the UK. In January, we hope to host the Intermediate Maths Challenge (for Year 10/11 pupils) with the Junior version taking place in April. Thank you to Dr Treanor for his hard work in organising and facilitating the event.



New guidance strengthens online pre-recruitment checks for shortlisted candidates. Schools must verify digital footprints and ensure no red flags are missed.


